A supported living service for adults with learning disabilities

## In brief

- Eight newly developed one-bed flats. All flats include kitchens and shower rooms.
- Part of a larger LD service covering four schemes in close proximity.
- Minimum support requirement of 5-10 hours support per week.
- Visiting support staff – hours tailored to individual need.
- No overnight staff in building but waking night in high support scheme next door.
- Options for assistive technology to maximise independence, with local staff available in emergencies.
- Communal facilities –communal lounge area, wheelchair accessible communal WC at ground level, garden/, 2 wheelchair accessible parking spaces for visitors and deliveries.
- Ability to access social events at local schemes.
- Close to local shops, bus routes, Overground station.
- Referral to all units through the borough's waiting list. However, we will take referrals directly. Please feel free to contact us with any questions.

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## About the service

Outward, part of the Newlon Group, is a registered charity providing support services across North, East and South East London to a range of vulnerable people, promoting improved choice and greater independence. Outward has been supporting people with Learning Disabilities and Autistic Spectrum Disorders (ASD) for over 40 years

At 203 Linwood Crescent, the support that each person gets is tailored to their own needs. By living in a supported living service, a person with a disability can be as independent as he or she wants, while also being supported to do the things he or she wishes and needs to do. This also means that the person can live in his or her own local community.



## Aim of service

Outward's team follows these key principles: to uphold the rights of each customer, encourage and promote independence, give choice at every opportunity and ensure inclusion in our service delivery.

Customers are supported to maintain life skills and confidence needed to sustain their tenancy and live independently in their homes, as well as providing opportunities to take part in social activities in the scheme and local community.

## Type of support

Our support is tailored to meet each customer's individual needs and includes:

- Supporting customers to access local amenities such as healthcare, leisure activities and befriending.
- Supporting customers to maintain and develop new skills and become more independent.
- Supporting customers to maintain the skills needed to carry out household tasks, such as cooking, cleaning and shopping.
- Supporting customers to keep their flats well repaired and homely, and to uphold health and safety in the communal parts of the scheme.
- Supporting customers to manage money and paying bills, going to appointments, socialising and meeting new people.

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
